Slide notes: The system does not ask for any Account to Scrap to, because the Disposal Accounts listed on the Asset Control Code for the Asset will be used.






Slide notes: When we look at this Asset afterwards, we can see on the Asset Item Values that the Asset has been scrapped.





Slide notes: All the Depreciation has been written back, and the Asset has been scrapped.




