



Slide notes: The Job Master is directly accessible from the Planned Maintenance Menu, because each Maintenance Master is a Job.






Slide notes: We can define a new Job here, but usually the Job already exists, and when we include it on the Planned Maintenance Master, then we need to ensure that it has the Cost Types listed, with the required auto Debit Accounts, as specified for the Planned Maintenance operation. Note here the 3 Cost Types for Planned Maintenance.







Slide notes: Let us quickly look at the Control Parameters for Planned Maintenance.




