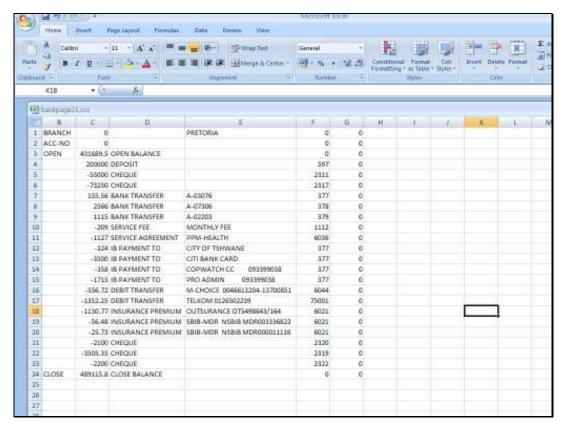
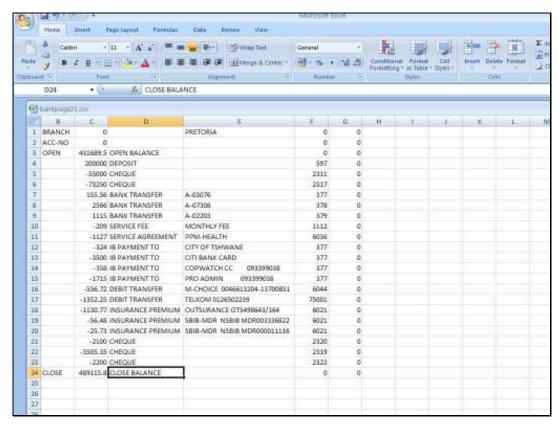


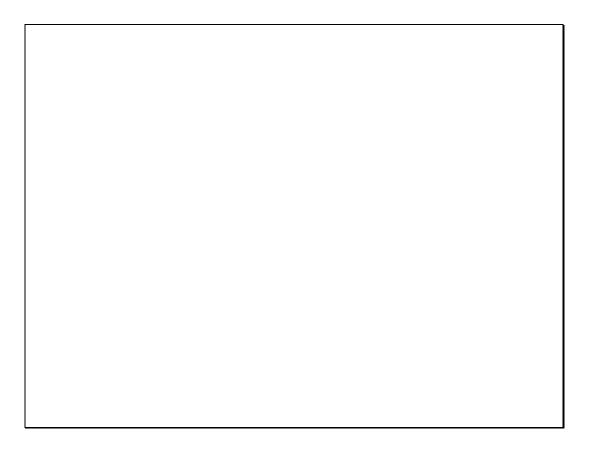
Slide notes: When we receive an electronic Bank Page from the Bank or download it from Internet Banking, it will be similar to what we see here. Banks usually provide a CSV format option, and that is a format that we can open in a spreadsheet like this.



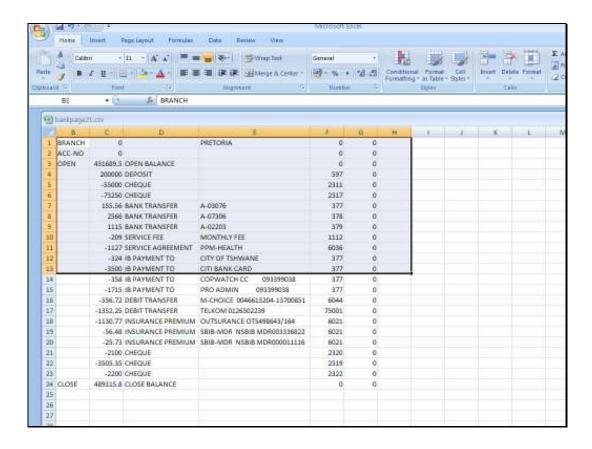
Slide 2 Slide notes: Note the Open Balance at the top and the Closing Balance at the bottom. We will not use these Items.

Slide notes: In fact, we can refer to electronic Bank Pages as virtual pages, because we can download data regularly and apply it to our Recon without waiting for the Bank Statement to arrive, if we want.

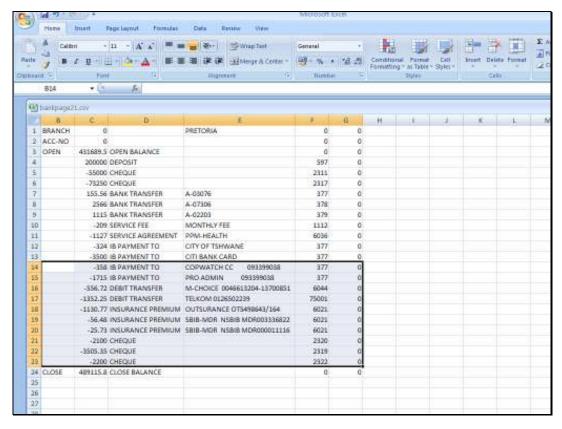


Slide notes: And in such cases where we do downloads, we may often have data included that we have imported before into our Recon. For example, if the highlighted data are lines that we have already imported, then we can just delete the section.

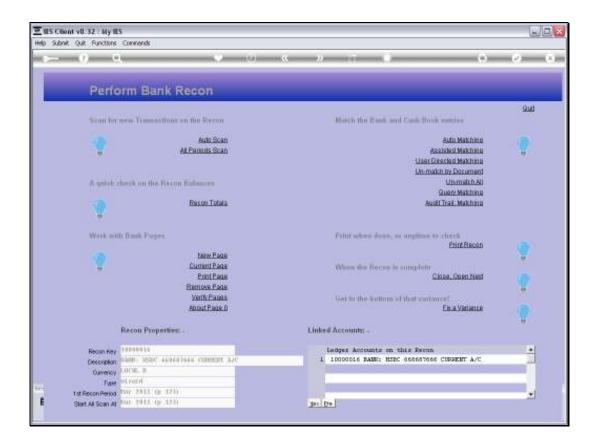

Slide notes: It is the same as on our electronic Page. However, the electronic page format can be different, and if we download part pages regularly, the opening Balance may not agree because then we may work with data portions that do not agree with exact Bank Pages. Nonetheless, it is perfectly fine to do so, as long as we load the correct entries, without skipping any, and without duplicating any.

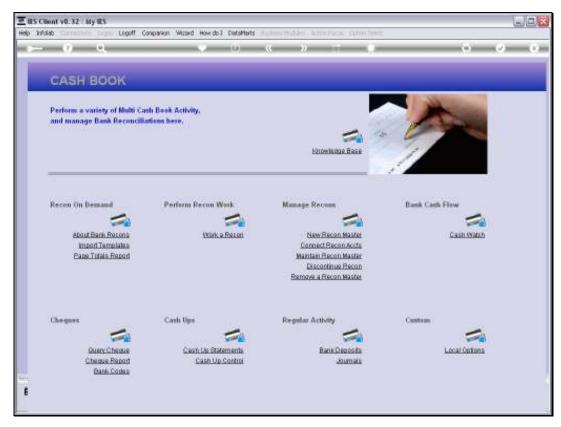

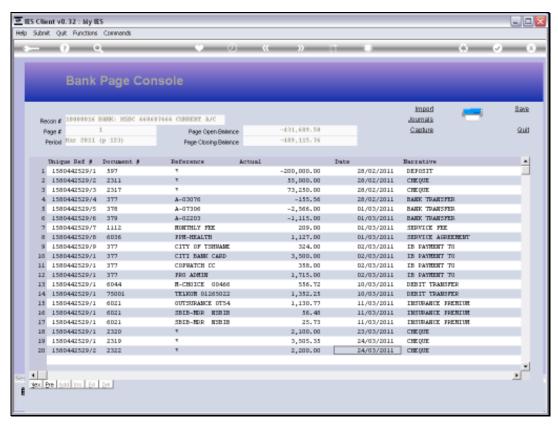
Slide notes: The Bank Page is imported instantaneously and the Page closing balance should agree with the actual Bank Page closing balance.



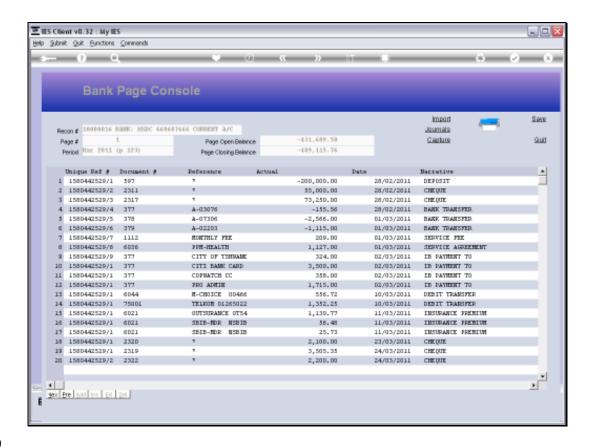
