Slide notes: We can use a Chart of Accounts in IES that does not rest on the IES Chart structure. But when we use the internal structure, then the 1st primary segment in any Ledger series is that of the Department. 'Department' is a term that we have standardized on, and it is widely used for Report Writing. The Department is really a structural Business Unit, and we can apply it in a manner as will suit our local needs.



Even though we use the standard term of 'Department', the application can be different for various Businesses ...

Departments in the Chart of Accounts can be a simple sequential option in a series, for example a 3-digit Dept without sub elements can range between 101 and 999, like :-

- 101 Accounts
- 203 Personnel Department
- 515 Factory
- Etc.

Slide notes: There are various ways in which the Department segment can be applied. It can even be a straight forward sequential number in a defined range, without any sub elements. For example, if our Department is defined to be in the range of 100 to 999, then each available slot in this series can be a Department with a different Name, and without having to use all the available slots.

Then again, the Department Segment can be structured by Sub segments, for example a Palm Oil Agri Estate, like: -

Dept segment Other segments
↓ ↓
11120302-10-123-55000

And where the sub elements for the Department are: -

Digit 1	Ledger Series
Digit 2	Ownership, e.g. Company or Small Farmers
Digit 3	Office, e.g. HQ, Project, Estate
Digits 4 & 5	Estate Number
Digit 6	Division
Digits 7 & 8	Block or Section (piece of land, or 00 for non-land)

Slide notes: Then again, the Department segment, which allows both alphas and numbers, may be structured with sub elements, as shown in this example of a Palm Oil Plantation. Here we have the Department segment being 8 digits, and with digit 1 being the Ledger Series, digit 2 the Ownership, digit 3 the Office, etc. The Department segment is a requirement in the Account Code, and can be applied in the best way to suit the local requirements for the Chart of Accounts.
