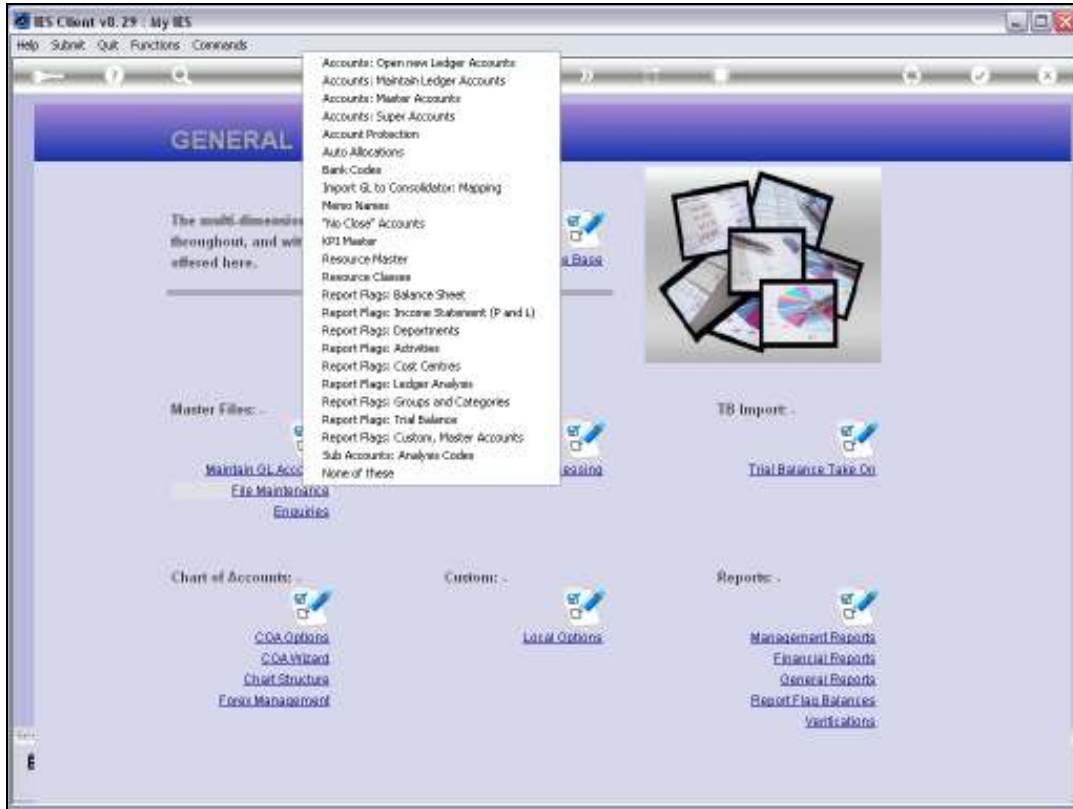


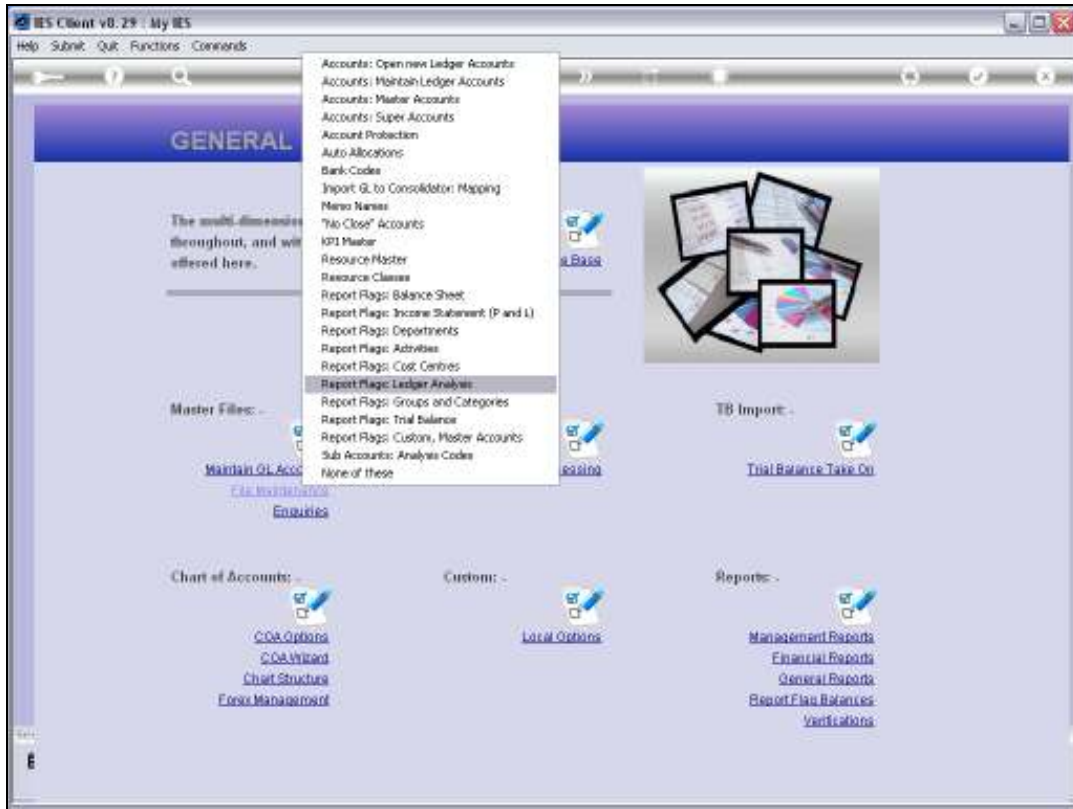

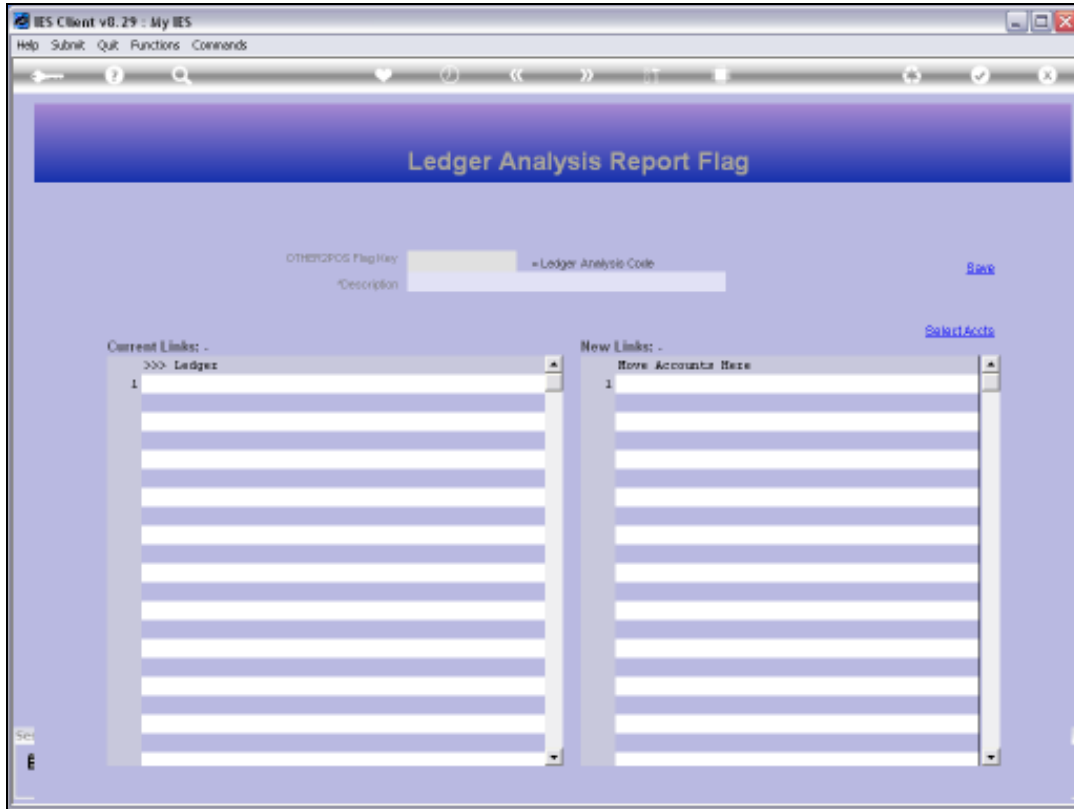
Slide notes: Ledger Analysis Report Flags can be imported at System Setup, or defined from the Ledger File Maintenance option.



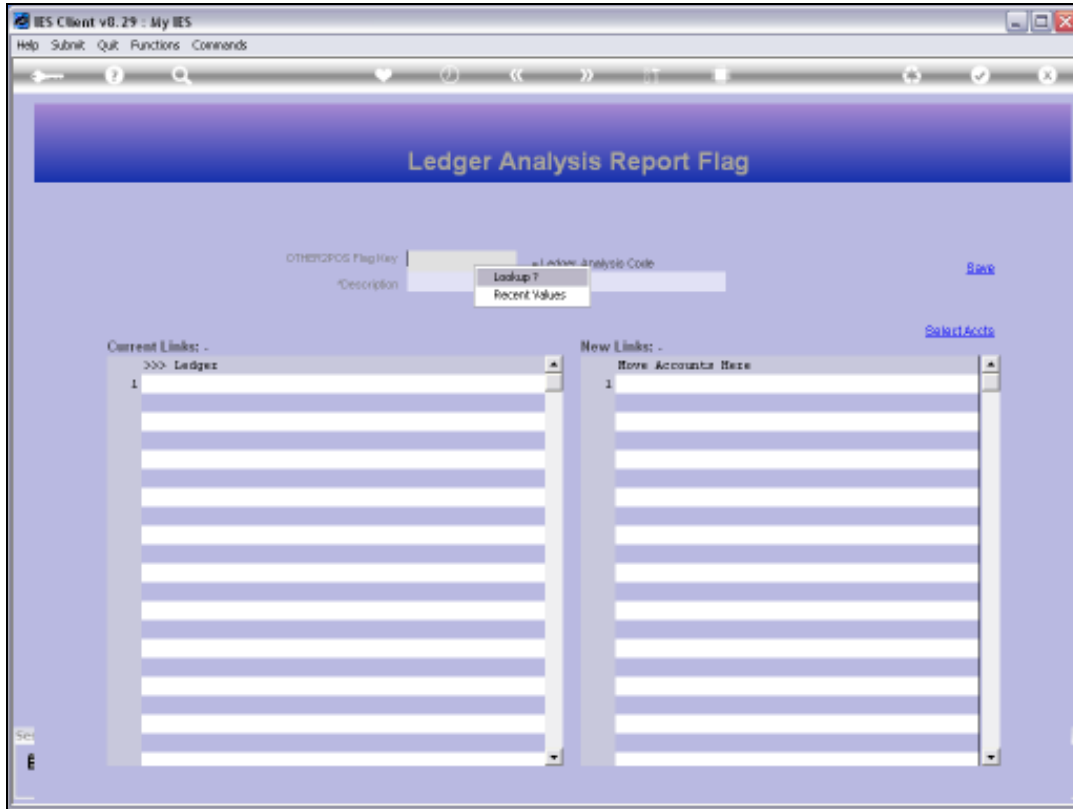

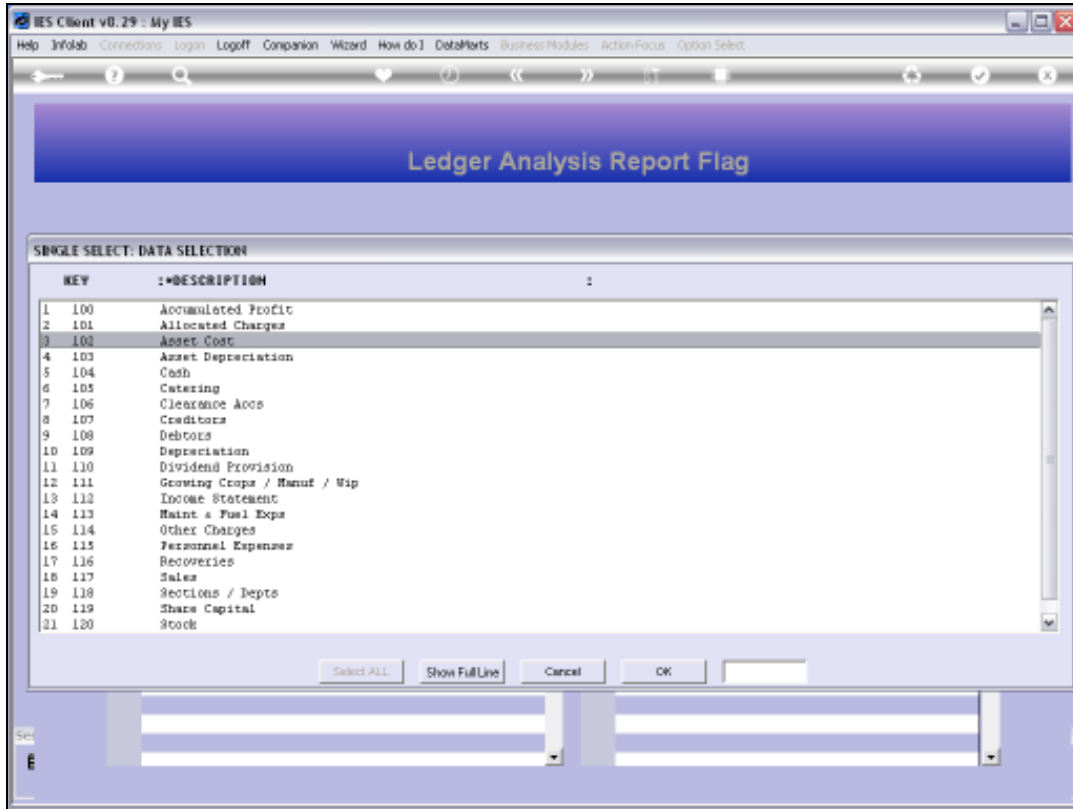
Slide notes: The usual lookups are available for retrieving an existing Flag, or else, to define a new Flag, we may assign a unique short Key and a Name for the Flag.



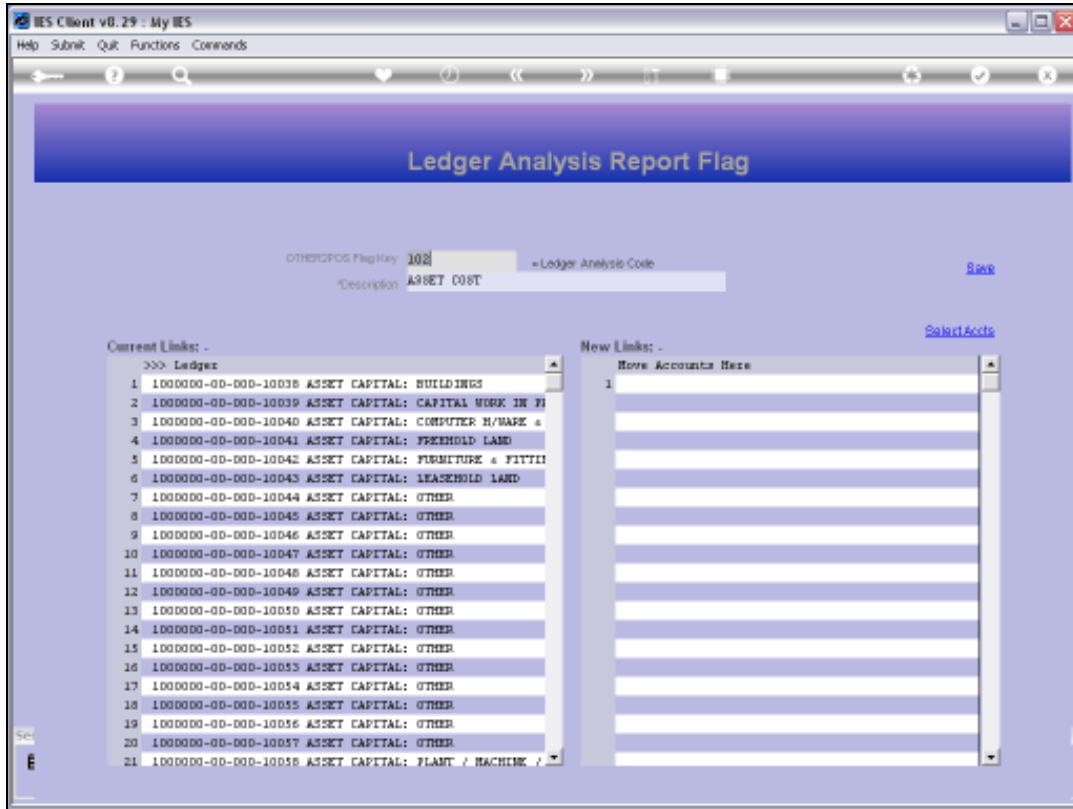

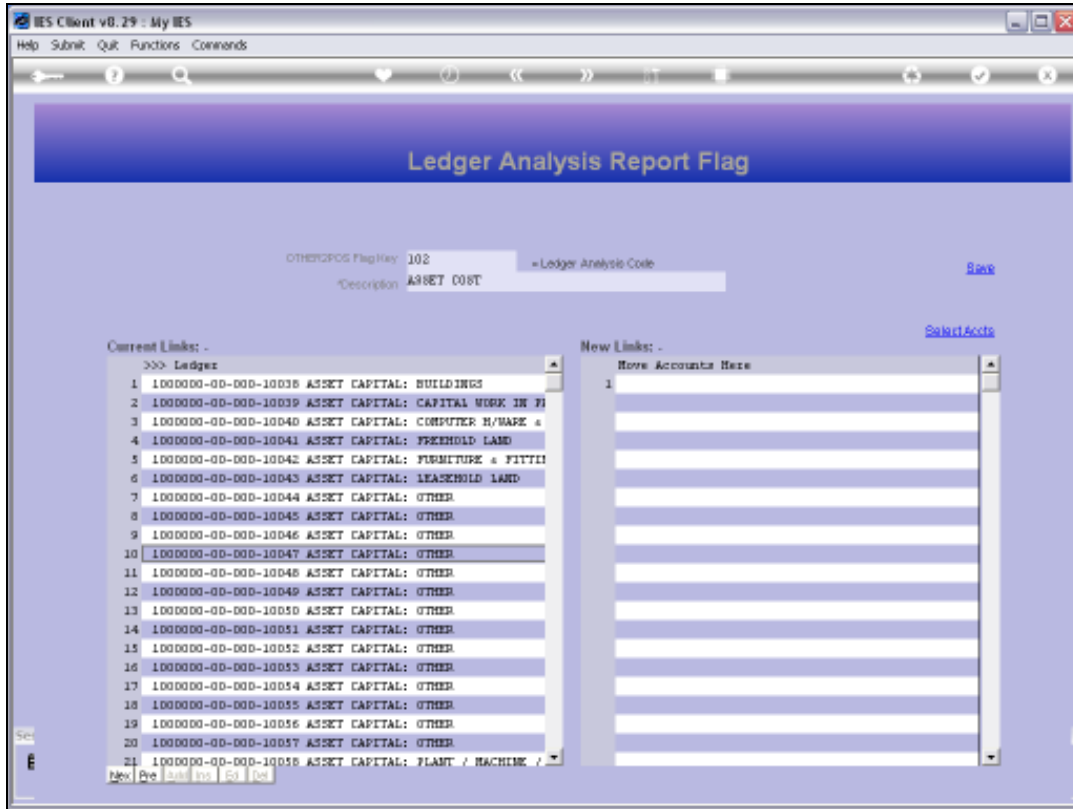

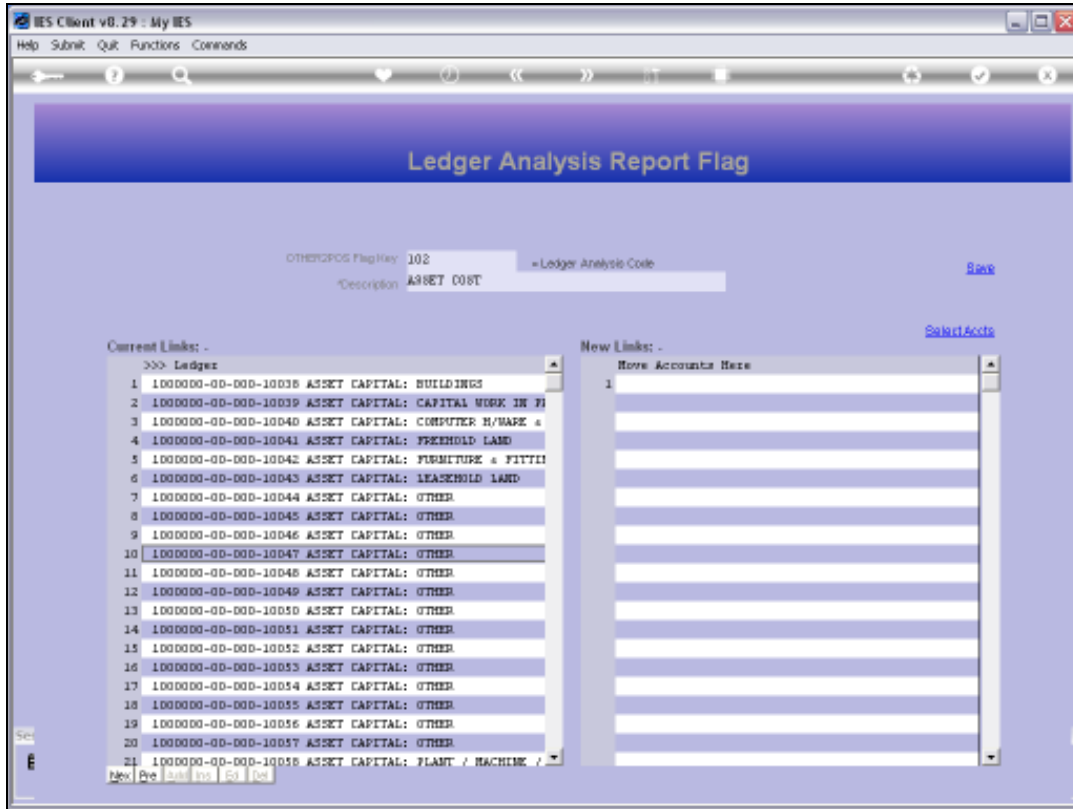

Slide notes: Any GL Accounts that currently use this Flag will be listed at 'Current Links'.

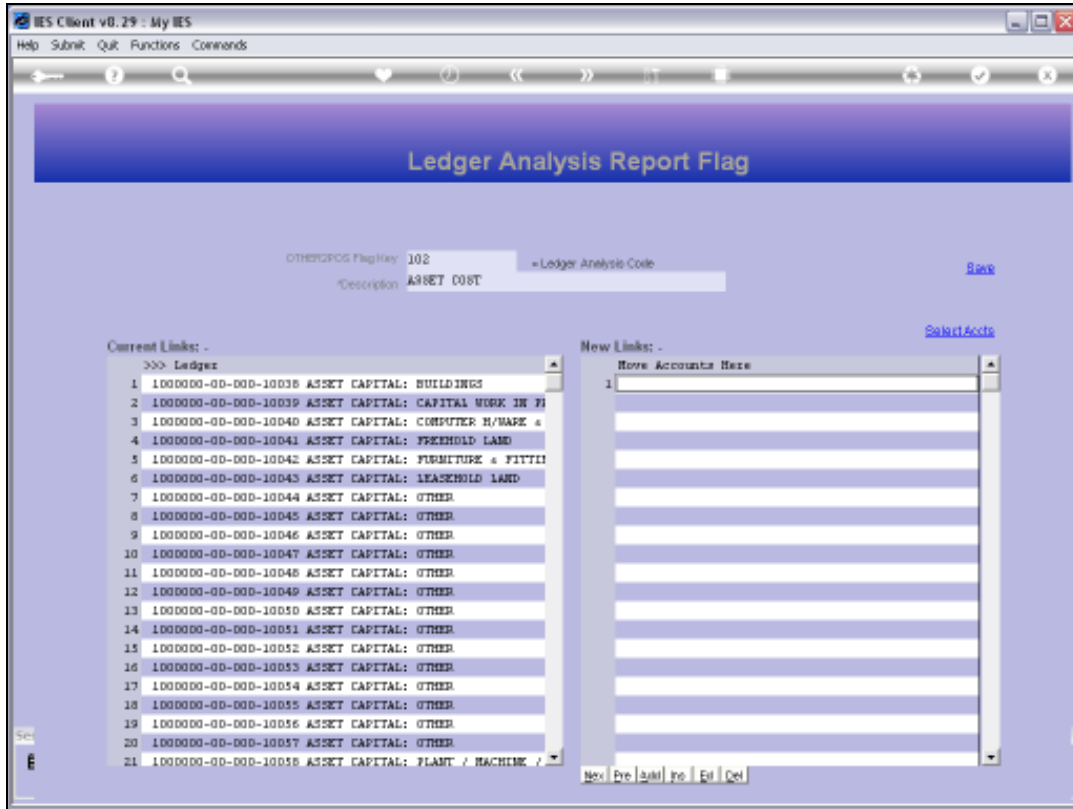

Slide notes: We may use the 'Select Accounts' function to select Accounts that should use this Flag, or we can manually lookup and list them at 'New Links'. When we save the Flag, any Accounts listed at 'New Links' will be updated to use the Flag, and next time we open the same Flag those Accounts will be included at 'Current Links'.

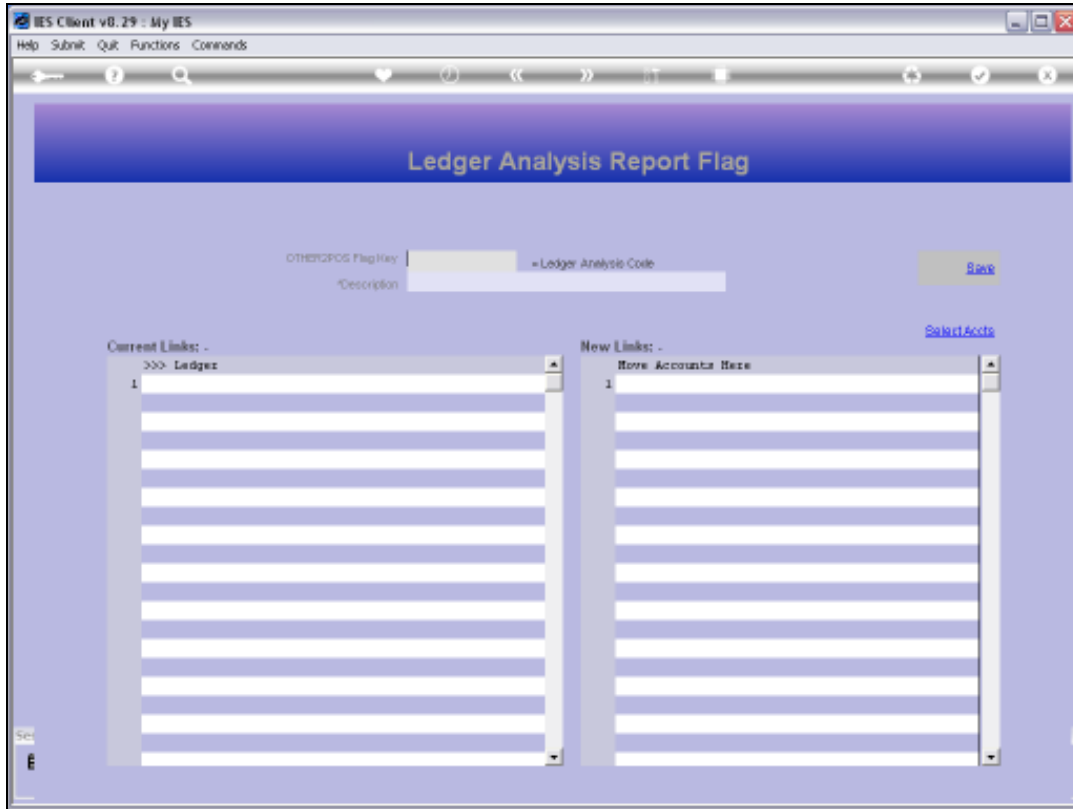

Slide notes: So what is the Ledger Analysis Report Flag? We use the various types of Report Flags for GL Reporting, for Lookups and for Data Selection. The Flags, when assigned to Accounts, provide us with easy ways to select the Accounts that have a certain Flag, total them on Reports, etc.
